## How it works

*Transforming Leaders* is a commitment to developing the ability to effectively serve and lead.

**Our goal** is to help build servant-led communities that have experienced healing and know how to reach out to others. We come alongside leaders to equip and empower them to succeed as they serve and strengthen their community.

Through *Transforming Leaders*, we provide support and training through a series of interactive, two-to-three day retreats. Our curriculum is organized into three separate training areas: Servant Leadership, Effective Leadership and Healing Leadership.

## What is a leader?

**We all have our own definitions of a leader.** The corporation president, the church pastor, the local politician — all are positions of leadership that carry both authority and responsibility.
